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New technology showcased at China Hi-Tech Fair

A wide range of technologies are covered, including nanotechnology, multimedia, logistics and RFID technology, advanced manufacturing, and biotechnology.

During the Fair, HKUST will also host a signing ceremony to mark the initiation of a new collaboration agreement with a prominent mainland manufacturer on the development of a nanomaterialbased high-capacity lithium battery, the latest in a series of successful technology transfer agreements reached by HKUST.

"HKUST is now pouring in more resources to fund research into the new technologies required by industry in the Pearl River Delta. The University will also continue to leverage its extensive relationships with international research institutions and multi-national corporations to boost the development of advanced technologies which can find immediate practical application in China," said President Paul Ching-Wu Chu.

A state-sponsored fair, CHTF is co-hosted by the Ministry of
Commerce, the Ministry of Science and Technology, the Ministry of
Information Industry, the National Development and Reform
Commission, the Ministry of Education, the State Intellectual
Property Office, the Chinese Academy of Sciences, the Academy of
Engineering, and the Shenzhen Municipal People's Government.
